

The 10 Best Caribbean/Mexican All-Inclusive Resorts For Food – 2014

Sandals LaSource Grenada

It's the newest resort on this list, but it's quickly earned the top spot for 2014, with simply sensational food across nine restaurants, including Butch's Chop-house, a first for the Sandals brand. Crucially, the property is making a significant push to source its food locally.

Zoetry Agua Punta Cana — Dominican Republic

This property could best be described as a boutique-style all-inclusive, and the resort's four restaurants are exceptional. Perhaps more importantly, you never need to make a reservation at any of them — truly a luxury at a Caribbean all-inclusive.

Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Punta Cana — Dominican Republic

Returning to the Best All-Inclusives for Food list this year is the terrific Hard Rock, which has nine restaurants that are diverse but equally delightful. It's big and brash, to be sure, but the Hard Rock delivers in the culinary department.

Grand Velas Riviera Maya – Mexico

This Riviera Maya institution helped redefine what people expect from all-inclusives when it comes to food. Grand Velas has eight restaurants, ranging from classic French to Asian, under the supervision of top Spanish Chefs Bruno Oteiza and Mikel Alonso.

Galley Bay — Antigua

Perhaps Antigua's signature all-inclusive resort, this Elite Island Resorts property has four restaurants from fine dining to casual beachfront fare, all served with equal quality and attention.

The Caves Negril — Jamaica

This Negril classic is part of the Island Outpost collection, which means it's as good as it gets in Jamaica and the wider Caribbean. The cuisine here emphasizes local sourcing and local flavors, meaning you get a real taste of Jamaica (not to mention unlimited servings of Blackwell Rum, made by Island Outpost founder Chris Blackwell). And yes, you can arrange dinner inside a cave.

Couples Swept Away — Jamaica

Another gem in bohemian Negril, Couples Swept Away has a wide selection of restaurants, from the elegant Feathers restaurant to poolside Thai eatery Lemon Grass. All in all, it's worth the trip just for the food.

Sivory Punta Cana — Dominican Republic

This Dominican Republic resort emphasizes what it calls "art cuisine," and the minute you are served it's easy to see why. From the Mediterranean Laveranda to the international Gourmond, Sivory raises the needle in a big way.

Spice Island Beach Resort — Grenada

With just 32 rooms, this Grenadian jewel is on the boutique side, but the food is world class, at both the property's Sea and Surf Terrace and Bar and its flagship Oliver's Restaurant, which beautifully emphasizes the richness of Grenadian cuisine.

Secrets Maroma Beach — Mexico



Farmers' Almanac Predicts Another Nasty Winter

The folks at the Farmers' Almanac can be forgiven for feeling smug: The 198-year-old publication correctly predicted the past nasty winter while federal forecasters blew it. Memories of the polar vortex and relentless snowstorms won't soon be forgotten. And the editors of the publication are predicting more of the same for the coming season.

"Shivery and shovelry are back. We're calling for some frigid conditions, bitter conditions," said managing editor Sandi Duncan.

The latest edition forecasts colder-than-normal and wetter-than-usual weather for three-quarters of the country east of the Rocky Mountains. Drought-stricken California, along with the Pacific Northwest, will see normal precipitation and cool temperatures this winter, the almanac said.

The publication, not to be confused with the New Hampshire-based Old Farmer's Almanac, uses a secret formula based on sunspots, planetary positions and lunar cycles for its long-range weather forecasts. Modern science doesn't put much stock in the formula.

NCL'S NEW SMOKING POLICY

As the health and well-being of our guests and crew is of the utmost importance, Norwegian Cruise Line will institute changes to its smoking policy for all sailings on or after November 1, 2014. The specific changes prohibit smoking on stateroom balconies and limit smoking in the casino to players. On Norwegian Getaway and Norwegian Breakaway, smoking on The Waterfront will be permitted on the starboard side, except by the outdoor dining areas.

Public areas throughout all our ships are smoke-free. If you smoke regular or electronic cigarettes, you can do so in designated areas only. If you prefer pipes or cigars, you can smoke in the Cigar Bar or designated smoking lounge. Smoking cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, cigars and pipes is permitted in outdoor public guest spaces and open decks where designated by the ship's management based on the ship's specific characteristics and arrangement. Smoking, including electronic cigarettes, is prohibited in or near venues serving food, the jogging track, outdoor sporting venues, The Haven outdoor areas and children's pool areas. On ships with The Waterfront, smoking is permitted on the starboard side excluding any food service areas. Active Casino players may smoke cigarettes in the Casino during gaming hours. Cigarette smoking is not permitted in any other indoor venue or location.


Guests are not permitted to smoke cigarettes, e-cigarettes, cigars or pipes in their staterooms or on their balconies. Cigar and pipe smoking in staterooms and on balconies is prohibited. Smoking inside your stateroom or on your balcony will result in a \$250 cleaning charge added to your onboard account. If cigarette burns on furniture, linens, towels or carpeting are detected; guests will be advised and charged for the damages.

Electronic cigarettes cannot be used in public areas where there is a No Smoking policy in force; simply because these cigarettes look so realistic and therefore other guests' perception is that we are not enforcing the No Smoking rule.

How The Airlines Raked In \$30 Billion in Ancillary Fees

Checked bags, onboard food, the ability to pick your seat, seat upgrades... As long as revenue growth continues like this, expect the airline industry to not only maintain their ancillary fee programs but to also find new and innovative ways to charge passengers even more.

Airlines made a whopping \$31.5 billion globally in ancillary fees last year according to a new report, up 11 percent from the \$28.1 billion they earned in 2012 and up more than 1,200 percent from 2007, generally considered the year ancillary fees first began.



"What began as a trickle has grown to a flood," the report stated.

To be fair, the totals for ancillary fees do include such things as affinity credit cards. But the worst part for fliers?

"We have a fair amount of room to grow yet," said Jay Sorensen, the president of IdeaWorksCompany, a Wisconsin-based airline consultancy which helps airlines find and implement new revenue streams.

IdeaWorksCompany and CarTrawler, a rental car services company, commissioned the survey, which includes data from 59 airlines. Leading the way is United Airlines, which brought in \$5.7 billion in ancillary fees last year, more than double the No. 2 airline, Delta, which earned \$2.53 billion. American Airlines came in third with \$2.1 billion.

But nowhere are ancillary fees more important as a revenue stream than at Spirit Airlines, famous – or infamous, depending on how you look at it – for its low fares but numerous add-on fees. Ancillary fees accounted for 38.4 percent of Spirit's total revenue last year, according to the report.

Spirit made \$51.22 per passenger on ancillary fees.

Sordevolo's Passion Play (September 13-22, 2015)

Every five years, a small hamlet nestled against the Italian Alps comes to life to tell the story of Jesus Christ. Sordevolo, in the region of Piedmont, is the host for La Passione Di Cristo (The Passion of Christ). The play, illustrating Jesus' later life from when he arrived in Jerusalem until his Resurrection, has run every five years since 1815, and will celebrate its 200th anniversary in 2015.

Sordevolo is one of only three cit-

ies that host such an event. Other hosts include Oberammergau, Germany (where arguably the most famous Passion Play occurs every 10 years) and Kuopio, Finland. Legend has it that Sordevolo vowed to host the play after being spared from the plague in 1634. The actors put on 31 performances in 97 days, as the show runs every weekend from June 6 to September 27, 2015.

During the performances, the town's population of about 1,300 doubles, as the 4,000-square-meter outdoor amphitheater can seat 2,500. The play involves the entire community, which spends nearly a year preparing for the event. About 400 locals perform, while 300 more serve as crewmembers backstage, making costumes, or designing the set; many specific acting roles -- played by everyday citizens, not professional actors -- are passed down through the generations.

Sordevolo's play still uses the original script, written in 1500 by Giuliano Dati in an ancient Italian dialect called Laudi. Dati, a native of Florence and a chaplain of a church in Rome's Trastevere neighborhood, used the scripts for the Colosseum's annual Good Friday performance of the Stations of the Cross, which was held until 1539. The play is not only written in the ancient language, but also performed in it, presenting a challenge for both locals and visitors to follow.

The amphitheater recreates a section of ancient Jerusalem in 33 A.D., using the city's streets as the setting for places such as Calvary (Jesus' crucifixion site) and Herod's Palace (where Jesus' trial was allegedly held before Pontius Pilate). In 29 scenes, the performance depicts the most important and most famous moments from Jesus' life, including Judas' betrayal, the Last Supper, and Jesus' burial and Resurrection.
